

2015 Jedi Knight Awardee



Dan Bernal has served as Chief of Staff for Congresswoman Nancy Pelosi, Democratic Leader for over 13 years. Prior to 2002 Dan provided public affairs consulting services to a diverse range of clients including office of California Governor Gray Davis, James Irvine Foundation and San Mateo County School-to-Career Partnership. As Special Assistant for Policy and Public Affairs at the U.S. Department of Education, March 1997 to January 2001, Dan managed nationwide activities for President Clinton, Vice President Gore, Cabinet Secretaries and Members of Congress such as National School Modernization Day, 25th Anniversary of Title IX, and America goes back to school. He has served as Assistant to the Political Director and Interned for Chief of Staff Leon Panetta White House, Executive Office of the President. Dan has been a top fundraiser for the AIDS/LifeCycle and does that annual 7-day, 545 bike ride from San Francisco to Los Angeles himself to raise money and awareness in the fight against HIV/AIDS. 2015 Circle of Courage Awardees



Esta Soler founded Futures Without Violence over 30 years ago with a mission of preventing violence against women and children. Under her direction, the organization was a driving force behind the Violence Against Women Act—the nation's first comprehensive federal response to the violence that affects families and communities. Soler is a recipient of the Kellogg Foundation National Leadership Fellowship, and recently delivered a TEDTalk charting 30 years of technologies—from the Polaroid camera to social media—that have shaped the movement to end domestic violence.

2015 Circle of Courage Awardees



Patti Chang, CEO is the former President and CEO of the Women's Foundation California. Patti has served as a Commissioner on the United States Commission on International Religious Freedom and the San Francisco Commission on the Environment. She was the President of the San Francisco Commission on the Status of Women where she chaired taskforces on Sexual Harassment, Sexual Assault, and Domestic Violence. She served as the board chair of the Women's Funding Network and the Women's Institute for Leadership Development working on human rights. She currently serves on the boards of the Women's Media Center and YES! Magazine. Patti was instrumental in passing the Convention to Eliminate all forms of Discrimination Against Women, making San Francisco the first city to adopt an international treaty.



Joanne Hayes-White was sworn in by Mayor Newsom as the 25th Chief of the San Francisco Fire Department on January 16, 2004. Hayes-White is a San Francisco native. She was hired as a firefighter in April 1990, promoted to the rank of Lieutenant in 1993 and to the rank of Captain in January 1996. In May 1996 she was made acting Battalion Chief with oversight of the Department's dispatch and communications systems. In December 2012, she was appointed by Democratic Leader Nancy Pelosi to the Presidential Public Safety Officers' Medal of Valor Board. Chief Hayes-White is a current board member of the St. Anne's Little Sisters of the Poor and served on the Boards of the American Red Cross - Bay Area Chapter for nine years, and now serves as an Honorary Board Member.

2015 Keynote Speaker



Liz Abzug is a Founder of The Bella Abzug Leadership Institute (BALI) for young women whose mission is to "inspire young women and girls to lead the future". She is a Professor in Urban Studies and Women and Leadership at Barnard College/Columbia University where she teaches courses on American cities, urban economic development and community building. She was the sole Professor for and who developed the Kenneth Cole Community Engagement and Social Action course at Columbia University. Under New York's former Governor Mario Cuomo, Liz was New York State's Chief lobbyist in Washington DC for all of the New York State's economic development agencies. Liz also held the position of the Deputy Commissioner of Operations of New York State's Human Rights Enforcement agency. She is currently on the Advisory Board of Directors and helped to conceptualize a nationally distributed glossy magazine called KIWI- a magazine targeted to families, parents and children of all ages.

Elmy's community and civic involvement includes Chair of the CA Commission on the Status of Women and of the Women's Foundation of CA. She co-founded HOPE – Hispanas Organizing for Political Empowerment serves on the board of MALDEF, Complete Count for Census 2010, Feed the Hunger and Transparent Democracy.
